
Andrew was very taken with how the children of all ages, engage with various aspects of farming, including milking, feeding cattle and growing crops and the machinery used to do so.





And So Winter Begins

East Dean's annual village bonfire was held on Wednesday 5th November and was a great success, thanks to rather better weather than had been forecast and a good turnout from all the valley villages, despite the unpromising forecast!

The fire was lit at 6.30 by Max Davies, who also provided the stunning display of fireworks that followed. Theoretically these are funded from year to year by a collection taken on the night, but whenever I have asked Max how well that actually works out he only ever replies "It's not an exact science". I think we all know what that means, so thank you Sir!

The photos show some of the crew building the bonfire the preceding Sunday:- Jon Bailie with the dubious honour of being on top arranging the wood, Simon Lillywhite passing the pallets up to him, Parish Council Chair Chris Tyas passing them to Simon, and some bald old bloke hanging around trying to look helpful! Glenn Ward, Justin Pollard and Adrian Murphy also worked like Trojans on the day, but unfortunately weren't in shot when Helen Bailie took the photo. The other two pictures were taken by Bea Harling and show Max wielding the lighting pole (imagine an enormous cotton bud) and the fire which quickly took hold. The crowd was much bigger than it looks here, it's just that most of them were standing well back because it was, unsurprisingly, very hot! Incidentally the reason for lighting the fire at 6.30 every year is because that was 15 minutes after the last bus of the day to East Dean. Admittedly the last bus left in 1976, but why mess with tradition! For the same reason the East Dean fire is always actually on the 5th, except when that is a Sunday.

It was also the first outing for pub landlord Jim MacDonald's new mobile fish and chip van which was a popular addition to the entertainment on offer - a queue soon formed and stayed steady throughout the evening. West Dean Parish Council Meeting 12th November 2025

Cllr Sam Renwick was co-opted by unanimous decision and welcomed as the new member of the council.

Reports were given by both the District and County Councillors. The District Council is considering installing many more ANPR cameras around Chichester to help prevent crimes, recognising cars with no insurance or MOT as well as locating vehicles of interest.

The only **rural crime updates** were regarding **catapults** fired along the Chilgrove Road and some damage to vehicles in West Dean. **Hare Coursing** had also been reported in the Chilgrove area.

There have been reports of **dog fouling** along the riverside in West Dean and signs regarding fines will be erected. Not using the supplied bins makes unpleasant conditions for everyone especially those maintaining the area.


West Dean Estate were congratulated for their work connecting the 2 phases of the Centurion Way in West Dean. This should be completed in early December meaning that the whole section will be away from the roadway, linking Chichester to Singleton.

The Council are continuing to review options to make the **school crossing** at West Dean safer. This discussion will carry on at the next meeting.

SPRAY, SQUIRT SHAKE!

Did you know that the UK uses around 550 million metal aerosol cans every year? From hairspray and deodorant to furniture polish and oven cleaners, aerosols are everywhere in our homes - and the good news is, empty aerosol cans can be recycled at home!

Yet, according to a recent survey, 22% of residents in West Sussex didn't know this! That's why **West Sussex Recycles** have partnered with **Alupro** and **Arun District Council** to raise awareness!

How to check if your aerosol can is empty?

Use the spray, squirt, shake method: **Spray** - No hiss and nothing comes out? It's empty.

Squirt - Nothing squirts out? It's empty.

Shake - No sloshing sound? It's empty.

If it is empty, pop it in your recycling bin. If it's not, take it to your local Recycling Centre and let staff know – they'll ensure safe disposal!

We were beautifully looked after by the team at the Fox, and the spirit of community, sisterhood and coming together to share friendship and a lot of laughter, was evident in bundles.



Singleton Village Hall - The Future...

Our Hall is an asset gifted years ago by Goodwood to the communities of Singleton & Charlton. However, in recent years, income from regular bookings has declined, whilst running costs have increased disproportionately. It costs roughly £3,500 a year to keep running, excluding any repairs and maintenance. Despite efforts to increase usage, the annual income covers barely half of these costs. There is a reserve of funds but these may be required for possible future repairs. Thus making the situation unsustainable in the long term. So it's now up to the community to decide whether the Hall is still needed and, if so, how we create a stable financial future for it. Or do we repurpose the Hall to provide an alternative income stream so that future costs are covered? To this end, every household in Singleton and Charlton will be receiving a questionnaire in January seeking the community's views on all aspects of the Hall's future and, crucially, how the Trustees can ensure that the Hall has a

viable future. I would urge you to respond to this questionnaire. The future of the Village Hall is in your hands. Graham Zacharias, Singleton Village Hall



GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION IS LAUNCHED ON THE FUTURE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN SUSSEX

You may remember that, back in the summer, we asked for your views on options for local government reorganisation and, along with the other seven councils in West Sussex, we subsequently submitted proposals to the Government for them to consider. This was after the Government invited the West Sussex councils to work together to develop proposals for our area.



Alongside the joint case, which can be found at shapingwestsussex.org, each council shared its preferred option with the Government. Our council, together with all other district and borough councils in West Sussex, unanimously supported the two-unitary model - one authority for Chichester, Arun, Worthing and Adur - and another for Crawley, Horsham and Mid Sussex. West Sussex County Council backed a single-unitary option.

The Government has now launched the formal consultation on the proposals to reorganise local government in Sussex at **gov.uk/government/consultations/local-government-reorganisation-in-east-sussex-and-brighton-and-hove-and-west-sussex**.

The consultation is open until Sunday 11th January 2026 at 23.59 and welcomes feedback from residents, businesses and stakeholders on all proposals put forward by councils across the region. Your input is important and will help shape the Government's final decision on the best way forward for Sussex. It's important that as many people as possible have their say, so please encourage friends, family and colleagues to get involved too. *Sarah J Parker, CDC*



12noon Wicked: For Good

In the fields around the village of East Dean you will have noticed crops of tall flowering plants. We call these winter cover crops and, as well as benefitting our soils and storing nutrients for the following crop they also provide food for birds and insects during the winter months.

These crops are part of environmental stewardship schemes which we have been participating in for 35 years now to encourage biodiversity and good farming practices. As a result, we have noticed an uplift in bird numbers which has been confirmed by surveys conducted by the RSPB in 2010 and again this past summer over a section of the farm. Other environmental options include managing chalk grassland, uncultivated margins around arable fields, growing plots of winter bird feed and herbal leys. These options suit our organic farming system as they encourage diversity and build soil health.

Most of the cattle at Droke are now housed for the winter. However, there is a small group of heifers running with an Angus bull which will be outwintered on pasture. These are surplus to our requirements for the dairy herd so will be sold in-calf to another dairy farm next summer. We still have a few fat lambs to sell over the next couple of months. As we have had such a wet and warm autumn encouraging good grass growth there is still plenty to graze and keep them growing.

At Goodwood the new robots I reported on last month are working extremely well and the cows are just loving their new lifestyle. There is now no twice-daily herding into the parlour as they are free to come and go as they please. Milk yields have also responded positively so happy cows and happy farmers!
