East Dean's Star and Garter has won the prestigious E2 Media Award of Excellence! A large number of people nominated the pub anonymously (avoiding the possibility of professional "influencers" skewing the result) and they praised variously the cheerful service, comfortable bedrooms and welcoming atmosphere but most importantly the quality of the food and drinks on offer.

Well it's good to have high standards recognised, but then you have to keep them up! With that in mind the Autumn/ Winter menu will start on the 1st October, featuring hearty seasonal favourites such as haunch of venison and steak and ale pie, as well as vegan risotto and vegetarian fish and chips (made with Halloumi). To start, or just for people with smaller appetites, there'll be soup of the day with homemade sourdough focaccia or treacle and whisky cured salmon or warm spiced cauliflower and chickpea salad, among other things. Everything on the menu is made, as far as possible, using locally sourced ingredients with weekly specials



depending on what is available on the day. Fish is a speciality of the Star with Jim going up to Billingsgate Market every week to bring home the best of the catch; he also buys fish to order for people to prepare themselves, so if you'd like to be included in that please join his WhatsApp group The Star Fish Stall contact the pub (01243 811318) to be included. The only way you'll get fresher fish is if you buy a trawler!





What began as a modest gathering of a few cars outside the Motor Circuit Café has grown into one of the South's best-known motoring traditions, still free to attend, still welcoming, and now attracting thousands of enthusiasts and families alike.

Each year, our events are shaped around a series of creative themes which have become part of their charm. 

If you don't fancy dining out (or can't get a table) the Star's casseroles are available hot or cold to take away in servings for 1-21 people in table serving dishes, so you could claim to have made them yourself, that's up to you. And as well as ready cooked food to take away, the pub offers freshly baked bread Monday to Saturday, eggs (hen and duck) and an expanding range of fresh local fruit and vegetables, depending what's in season.

Bookings are already being taken for Christmas parties, aside from which there are regular performances by talented musicians and coming up on the 13th November the annual craft fair, so if you've got some jewellery, carvings, home-knitted jumpers, soothing balms, Christmas ornaments or anything crafty you'd like to display, contact the pub to bag a space.

But before that comes the first quiz of the winter, at 7pm on Sunday 19th October. These happen once a month between October and March and are always done as a fund raiser for a local cause, this one's for St Wilfrid's Hospice. The format is simple enough: six rounds of 10 questions with a raffle and a break halfway through for supper, in this case homemade lasagne. They've become very popular, so given the limited space available it's advisable to get your team of six together and book a table ASAP. If you haven't got a team, or you're new to the village, turn up anyway and we'll find you one - it's a great way to get to know people and make new friends. Last year we ended up on a couple of occasions dragging extra tables and chairs in from the garden! Well, we never like to turn anyone away - but it was quite snug!

A care home worker who stole sentimental jewellery from an elderly resident has been jailed

Police were called after staff at Bethune Court in Boscobel Road, Hastings, reported the theft.

The victim – an 82-year-old woman – discovered jewellery including her late husband's gold wedding ring had been taken from the bedside table in her private room.

As enquiries were ongoing, the victim's family posted an appeal for information on social media. This was seen by a local pawnbroker, who believed they had recently accepted the same ring from a regular customer.

She was identified as a housekeeper at the care home. The 58-year-old woman was arrested and charged with theft, which she was convicted of.

She was sentenced to 15 months' imprisonment and charged with fraud.

EAST DEAN VILLAGE HALL CHRISTMAS CRAFTS FAIR


Saturday 15th November 10am - 3pm



Leisure Accessibility for Those Living With Sight Loss

West Sussex is fortunate to have a wealth of high quality theatres and cinemas, but for those living with sight loss, such a trip can be daunting, and the performance presents challenges in terms of appreciating everything that is happening on stage and screen. Thankfully, many venues support accessibility for people with visual impairments with audio descriptive tours/performances, touch tours, bespoke times to visit and concessions. For example, Chichester Festival Theatre offers audio description





on certain performances and free bookable Touch Tours prior to an audio described performance. All seats have Braille signage and Festival Season brochures are provided in large print, audio or a CD - plus cast lists in large print or braille. It also offers a Buddy Scheme with trained volunteers to meet you on arrival, help collect tickets and headsets, guide you to your seat, refreshments and toilets and sit with you during the show. It is important to contact them to plan a visit, as the booking process, logistics and concessions all vary.

CHICHESTER FESTIVAL THEATRE WINTER SEASON

This Winter, the National Theatre brings James Graham's Olivier Award-winning Dear England to Chichester; and Laura Wade's sparkling new play, based on Somerset Maugham's The Constant Wife, comes direct from the Royal Shakespeare Company.

Jane Austen's 250th anniversary is celebrated with a new stage production of Emma, while Being Mr Wickham is an intriguing look at the rogue from Pride and Prejudice. Caroline Quentin leads



Chekhov's classic **The Seagull**. Fans of detective thrillers will enjoy the stage debut of Inspector Morse: House of Ghosts, the Agatha Christie mystery Death on the Nile, and a chilling new ghost story, It Walks Around The House At Night.

RURAL CRIME **ACTION WEEK**

Last month's Rural Crime Action Week gave focus to a variety of police, partner and business campaigns and events that shine a light on the types of crimes experienced by people in rural areas.

Victims of rural crime may be more isolated, due to the geography of our county so we must ensure their voices are not ignored. Whether it is livestock or equipment theft, illegal hunting, arson, criminal damage or fly-tipping these offences not only impact farmers and landowners directly but have negative ripple effects into our economy, supply chains and environment.

A national survey conducted earlier this year revealed that 35% of landowners are affected by waste crime but not all of them report to the police. Operation Barley was set up to check vehicles, specifically vans and small lorries, that could be carrying waste illegally or have illegal agendas for disposing of waste.

The Sussex Rural Crime Team also introduced Operation Galileo, a dedicated effort to tackle hare coursing. Last month alone, the Sussex RCT conducted nearly 26 hours of Op Galileo patrols after receiving reports or intelligence relating to hare coursing.





Film Review

Memoria (2021)

This pure slice of Tilda Swinton arthouse, brought to us by Apichatpong Weerasethakul has just arrived on Channel 4 (in the UK at time of writing) and for those up for a slow-burn, meditative, quirky, hypnotic two and a quarter hours are in for a treat.

Tilda Swinton stars as Jessica Holland, a Scottish botanist in Bogotá, Colombia, who is suddenly plagued by a mysterious, deep sonic boom that only she can hear. She tries to find out what it was. And wonders if she heard it at all. Or if it was something from another time, place or universe. Or was it just in her head? She consults with a sound engineer who tries to recreate the sound from her description. The next day, he's gone and nobody knew him.

She continues her search which lands her in a remote jungle village where she meets a much older man, who has the same name, Hernán, as the sound engineer. He lives a reclusive life. He reveals that he is an "antenna" for the memories of the Earth, and he has a unique ability to connect with the planet's history and its past inhabitants. You can probably see where this is going - something otherworldly and off-piste!

The finale of the film throws much of what's gone before out the window as the film shifts gear doing a 180 in genre/ theme! So I'll say no more. The cinematography is lovely, with long, lingering shots - and the sounds cleverly let us in on what she's hearing and going through. And of course, it's the Tilda Show throughout, showing everyone once again how to act. Well worth a look but be warned - it's often a head-scratcher (at least until the final act)! *TS*

Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital Winter Wildlife Briefings

From October and throughout the winter we receive our highest numbers of hedgehog patients, despite this being when they should hibernate. Climate change's



unpredictability, disturbance from humans and increasingly fewer natural habitats are just some of the reasons why hedgehogs are struggling to hibernate and why their numbers are drastically declining in the UK. These changes are also disrupting breeding, with some hoglets now being born in winter instead of summer. Please watch out for any hedgehogs active during the daytime, behaving strangely or any possibly-abandoned hoglets. Please call us before intervening so our team can advise you on the best course of action. To help local hogs, you can leave out hedgehog/cat/dog food overnight to see them through these tricky winters (please remember: they are lactose-intolerant and our milk is incredibly bad for them). Thank you!

Patient Story

This beautiful peregrine falcon has been on quite the journey! He received initial treatment at a local vet before being transferred to us for ongoing rehabilitation. X-rays showed a nasty break in his wing likely caused by a road traffic collision. At first, we were unsure if he would be able to recover from such a bad injury, as peregrines are the fastest bird (and animal) in the world and rely heavily on good wing health for successful hunting and diving. However, our team were determined as ever to see him through! We initially wrapped up his wing to restrict movement and encourage the bone to heal, along with administering



antibiotics and pain relief. After a period of rest and recuperation, he was making remarkable progress and was keen to get back to the outside world. After several successful flight-assessments, it was determined that he was ready to be released and he was returned to the skies where he belongs. Good luck out there, magnificent one!





Is the tide turning once more? This is why now could be a key moment for upsizers...

After several years of a strong seller's market, we are beginning to see a shift in West Sussex. The pace is slowing,



We have been through many "ups and downs" of the property market and of course, our clients are always keen to buy when the timing is right - but when is this? We all wish we had a crystal ball, but history and experience tells us that moment could be soon.

In 2008 there was the global financial crash, when prices fell by approximately 15-20%. They then stabilised in 2009 before beginning to rise again later in 2012/13, especially in the Southeast. 



LOCAL COMMUNITY CLEAN UP THE LAVANT

In just four days, over 400kgs of litter has been removed from the River Lavant in and around Chichester. 36 committed volunteers and a class of local school children came together to tidy up this globally rare chalk stream which weaves its way through the West Sussex countryside and historic Chichester, before entering the sea at Chichester Harbour.

Led by staff from The Final Straw Foundation and the Western Sussex Rivers Trust, the dedicated volunteers removed 423kgs of litter, including 411 cans, 218 plastic bottles, 204 glass bottles, 31 vapes, 15 nitro oxide cylinders, 3 shopping trolleys, 1 radio, 1 walkman, 8 traffic cones and 314.27kg of metal items.

Globally there are only 300 chalk streams, 85% of which are found in the UK. Although these precious streams have been described as the UK's equivalent of the Great Barrier Reef they are under threat from pollution, litter and sewage. The River Lavant is no exception and is one of only ten Flagship Chalk Stream restoration projects in England.

Students from Lavant Primary School joined the clean up and managed to collect nearly 15kgs of litter in just 45 minutes on Sheepwash Lane. A great job done by everyone - please keep a look out for future clean ups and come join us!"


